From An Outreach Perspective

A few weeks ago, a representative of the St. Vincent de Paul Society gave a presentation after the Sunday Masses. During the presentation, we learned about the amazing work this Catholic Society is doing to help people in need. What was of particular interest to me is the development of a new property called Ozanam Place, named after Frederic Ozanam, the founder of the Society. It is one of the largest constructions here in Halifax. The building will be four stories high and will provide 38 living spaces for the homeless. Through this and other projects, the St. Vincent de Paul Society, continues the work of Ozanam, who wanted to show the vitality of faith in service to the poor by helping them to feel and recover their dignity as beloved sons and daughters of God. Every man and woman and child is precious in the eyes of God, and the work of the Society reminds us we are here on earth to love and to serve. Apart from the construction of Ozanam Place, the Society also operates Hope Cottage, a soup kitchen, and Hand-in-Hand, a thrift store. Here at St. Mary's we have an active St. Vincent de Paul Society. The members, through personal contact, work with the poor in our area to build relationships and to help them improve their lives.
